



## Call for Abstracts

### JEEM / REE Workshop on Nonmarket Valuation

#### Post-Conference Workshop—7th World Congress of Environmental and Resource Economists (WCERE 2026)

Date: 6-7 July 2026

Location: University of the Basque Country (UPV/EHU), Bilbao, Spain

The Journal of Environmental Economics and Management (JEEM) and Resource and Energy Economics (REE), in collaboration with the Faculty of Economics and Business at the University of the Basque Country and the Basque Centre for Climate Change (BC3), are delighted to announce a call for abstracts for the third joint Workshop on Nonmarket Valuation. Similar to the first two workshops in 2024 and 2025, the third workshop will be staged following the Annual Conference of the European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists (EAERE), which in 2026 coincides with the 7th World Congress of Environmental and Resource Economists (WCERE). While the WCERE will be held in Lisbon, Portugal, 29 June – 3 July, the workshop itself will take place at the **University of the Basque Country (UPV/EHU) in Bilbao, Spain**, a short direct flight from Lisbon.

The workshop will consist of two full days of presentations, **starting in the morning of July 6, and ending in the afternoon of July 7.**

Authors are invited to submit abstracts related to empirical and theoretical research on the nonmarket valuation of environmental and natural resources. This includes revealed preference (e.g., hedonics, travel cost, averting behavior), stated preference (e.g., contingent valuation, choice experiments), and benefits transfer applications. *Abstracts should include the title of the presentation, name of presenter, all other authors / researchers involved, and a project description*

*not exceeding 1,000 words.* Submissions from any region of the world are welcome. Authors may submit abstracts related to the same paper that they submit for consideration at the WCERE Conference if they agree to make the two presentations qualitatively different, perhaps by going into greater depth or emphasizing different aspects of the research in each presentation.

Each presentation will be allocated approximately 25 minutes at the workshop, including audience discussion. In contrast to the last two rounds, there will not be any special editions of REE or JEEM associated with this workshop.

The Program Committee, consisting of Professors Jette Bredahl Jacobsen at the University of Copenhagen, Michela Faccioli at the University of Trento, Robert Johnston of Clark University, Petr Mariel of UPV/EHU, Klaus Moeltner of Virginia Tech, and Roger von Haefen of North Carolina State University, will select 20-25 abstracts for presentation based on their overall quality and potential impact on the field. Preference will be given to abstracts that clearly indicate that the underlying project or (emerging) paper has gone beyond the “preliminary” stage, with meaningful results available to be shared with a workshop audience. Current and past editors of JEEM and REE will provide comments and feedback related to the potential suitability of each presented project / paper for journal submission, along with possible improvements that would enhance prospects.

Meals during the conference, as well as a reception on Monday night, will be covered by the organizers. We will not be able to provide travel support. The deadline for submissions is **6 March 2026**. Authors will be notified of acceptance decisions no later than **10 April 2026**.
